Introduction



Key Stage 2 Assessments

Children who are in Year 6 will be taking national curriculum tests (SATs) in May 2025. The tests will provide information about how your child is progressing, compared to children the same age nationally. They are not qualifications and don't affect your child's future options in school. The results are used to ensure that schools are teaching their pupils the essential knowledge and skills in the subjects that are the early building blocks. This is to ensure every child reaches their full potential.

This is because every child should leave primary school having mastered the key skills so they can reach their potential at secondary school and throughout their adult life.

SATs Week 2025

The tests will be administered during the week beginning 12th May 2025. They are timed tests on specific days. They will be sent to an independent marker to be marked externally and we will receive the results in July.

Teacher Assessment

How do we support our pupils for their self-esteem and confidence?

During the school year, we have 'formal assessment points'. This is where the children will sit previous year's SATs papers in test conditions. We ask that your children are present in school for these weeks.

Why do we do this?

- To help familiarise our children to test conditions, so that when they access their SATs in May, so they are familiar with routines.
- Ensure they develop readiness and feel prepared.
- Provide nurture throughout the process to develop the children's self-confidence, self-esteem and resilience for when they take their statutory assessments.
- Identify any gaps in learning to inform teaching.

How to Help

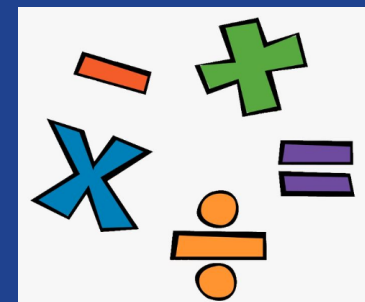
It is important that school and parents work in partnership so that every child can reach their full potential.
